Janet grew up in Salt Lake City. She was the only girl in a family with 5 brothers, She attended South High School and then the University of Utah. She was a very accomplished pianist and had a gorgeous soprano singing voice, which allowed her to be involved in many musical endeavors. Janet was invited to go to San Francisco to perform with the Metropolitan Opera there but she decided that that life would not be compatible with the family that she planned to have so she turned it down. Even while raising a large family though, Janet always pursued excellence in all that she did. In fact, she continued studying voice with a prominent vocal teacher in the area (probably until she was in her sixties) and was well known for singing in literally hundreds of church meetings and funerals and other events.

Janet has resided in the Garden Park Ward since 1960 and has served in so many capacities over those years. She loves all the wonderful friends she has in our Relief Society and looks forward to being able to return to Church and visit with you all again.
